Social and Emotional Development

As we know, many children's social and emotional development is as important, if not more so, than their academic development. So we also make sure to look at five different areas of development to support your child whilst they are with us at school. These are:

Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills, Self-Awareness and Responsible Decision Making.

Staff score students from 1 to 4 on how students respond to certain situations, from being interested in the world around them, to making friends with the opposite sex, to managing change and each area is out of 40.

1 Almost never

- 2 Seldom
- **3** Usually

4 Almost always

There are no ideal scores in the measuring system, so it is not a case of a student passing or failing. The aim is to target the areas where the scores are lowest and to show improvement next time.


Aladdin Trip
