

The Pathway

Year 10

- Your child will need to complete 5 units: These will be delivered within 3 mini projects.
- Each project will have a list of skills they need to demonstrate to achieve. This will be recorded within their portfolios.
- Enterprise (Business Studies) is mandatory in Year 10 and part of their timetable. This option allows your child to develop a range of skills and knowledge based on; team work, planning, organising, and working with others, to successfully deliver a range of events to the whole school. This will be added to their portfolios.

Year 11

- Your child will need to complete a further 5 units. There will be a further 3 projects that they will take part in.
- Some students my choose to progress on the to Level 1
 Award, please refer to this booklet for an outline of the pathway.

Preparing for Post 16

In Year 11 your child will spend one afternoon a week attending North Herts College.

This Transition programme has been designed to help your child adjust to the change of environment, different routines and tutors, preparing them for life after the Valley.
