
Welcome to The Valley School's Information Evening

Preparing for Post 16

This lesson is all about discovering the right pathway for your child after The Valley School.

It provides individual support in helping your child think about their next steps and what that looks like.

PSHE provides activities and experiences that allow your child to explore a range of different Post 16 environments.

A personal plan is then discussed to establish an appropriate pathway for your child and a transition programme is designed to help prepare them for Post 16/KS5



Science

There are 36 teaching items in total, 12 for each of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. In all three sciences, students develop their understanding of how scientific principles and concepts help describe complex and diverse natural phenomena in terms of a small number of key ideas. They also develop relevant practical skills.
